## Governor’s Idaho Meth Project Receives Financial Boost in Idaho Falls

Let’s face it, nobody wants to deal with the fact that meth use is a huge problem in our state, but talking about the issue more could be key to preventing it from starting in the first place.

That’s what the governor believes, who created the Idaho Meth Project.

In Idaho Falls Thursday night, a fundraiser dinner was hosted by the Mountain View Hospital.

Idaho’s project is modeled after one that had a high success rate in Montana. In just two years, the state’s amount of users decreased by fifty percent.

Megan Ronk, Idaho Meth Project Executive Director: “Research shows that you really need a constant, sustained effort in order to make an impact on behaviors and attitudes toward meth use and that’s what we’ll be doing with the meth project.”

To launch the Idaho Meth Project, \$2.7 million dollars needs to be raised. So far, nearly a million has been donated.
